

Communicating with your members

There's many ways you can communicate with your members other than on Club evenings or afternoons. Of course, face-to-face communication is always best but here are a few other ways you might like to consider...

- Notice Boards many clubs have noticeboards on display on club nights – you can share your own events, what's on, Area events, leaflets for local garden centres, local facilities, photos, articles involving your members etc. Here are a few examples overleaf of club noticeboards
- Club Facebook pages these are relatively easy to set up and a great way of sharing details of upcoming events, club information, sharing photos of demonstrations and related flower information, anything you like really. You can find out how to set up a club Facebook page on the website.
- Focus groups and surveys if you want to get feedback from your Club members on any particular topic or indeed feedback generally, you can consider small focus groups outside of club nights, perhaps invite a few members to coffee and cake and ask their opinions on things. You can also do more formal surveys asking questions on the Club's programme, its communications, what members would like to see in future programmes, that type of thing. An example of an example member survey page is overleaf, probably more useful in larger groups. Don't forget whatever method you use, it's important to share the results with your members at a later date.
- Club newsletters these are a great way to stay in touch with active and non-active members. They can be an email, a sheet of A4 circulated to members on email or given out on club evenings, Facebook posts or more detailed newsletters including articles and competition results. Here are a few examples of different newsletter formats you could try.

Have you heard of the 3.5.8 rule in flower arranging.

This refers to the concept of using three types of flowers, five stems of greenery, and eight stems of filler flowers in a floral arrangement. This rule provides a balanced structure to the arrangement by ensuring a harmonious combination of different floral elements.
